

2010-2011 CDH Chemical/Alcohol/Tobacco & Harassment Form for Co-Curricular/Athletic Activities

The CDH policy supercedes, where inconsistent with, the MSHSL rules

Students participating in Co-Curricular and/or Athletic activities at Cretin-Derham Hall are held to high standards and will demonstrate respectful and responsible behavior at all times for continued participation. Cretin-Derham Hall provides this policy and procedures to define school interventions in times of tobacco, alcohol, other drug use and harassment violations, and MSHSL Athletic/ Fine Arts Eligibility rules. In addition to the steps listed in the Student/Parent Handbook and MSHSL Athletic/Fine Arts Eligibility rules, the following eligibility consequences will be enforced.

First Offense: Students who participate in MSHSL Athletic/Fine Arts activities will lose Athletic competition and/or Co-Curricular participation for one-third (1/3) of the season.

Students who participate in co-curricular activities not regulated by the MSHSL, will lose eligibility for a minimum of two weeks up to 1/3 of the season, as determined by the Advisory Committee.

The student must participate in all practices and/or activity preparation in order to fulfill their ineligibility consequences. Attendance at the post-season banquet is at the discretion of the coach/advisor. The student is unable to participate or attend team or activity competition, events, or publicly represent CDH as a team/activity member during the loss of eligibility. Athletic/Co-Curricular eligibility consequences begin at the completion of the suspension period, when the student is in good standing, as defined by the MSHSL Student Code of Responsibilities.

Second Offense: Consequences may include, but not limited to, probation, or a required formal assessment. The student is subject to one of the following consequences:

- If the second offense occurs within 12 months (one calendar year) of the first violation, the student will lose Athletic competition and/or Co-Curricular participation for an entire calendar year. The loss of eligibility will begin at the date of notification of the second offense. At the coaches discretion, the student may participate in all practices and/or activity preparation, during their loss of eligibility. Attendance at the post-season banquet is at the discretion of the coach/advisor. The student is unable to participate or attend as a team member during the loss of eligibility, or publicly represent CDH as a team/activity member during this loss of eligibility. However, the student may attend events as a spectator.
- If the second offense occurs more than 12 months after (one calendar year) the first violation, the student will lose Athletic competition and/or Co-Curricular participation for one-third (1/3) of the season **or** lose eligibility equivalent to the terms of the MSHSL second offense (6 contest/competitions or 3 weeks) whichever is longer.

Third Offense: May result in immediate dismissal. If the student is allowed to stay at CDH, a third offense will result in loss of participation for an entire calendar year. If the student chooses to transfer to another school, the administration will notify the school to which the student is transferring of the previous violation history, as required by the MSHSL.

Additional Information related to all offenses:

* If a student is suspended from school, they are ineligible to participate in athletic/fine arts/co-curricular activities. The loss of participation related to eligibility consequences begins when the student completes the suspension and is in good standing, per MSHSL rules.

- If a student is not on the original sign-up sheet for a sport or co-curricular organization the first day of practice or meetings, the student may not sign-up for a sport or co-curricular organization if it has been determined that MSHSL Eligibility violation has occurred.
- The student must complete the full season of practices and eligible contest/events in which he/she is serving the eligibility consequences in order to be eligible for the next season of competition. If an injury occurs, the student must complete participation as a team member in order to complete their loss of ineligibility consequence.
- Students must serve a consequence in each activity in which they participate during that school year– MSHSL Athletics, MSHSL Fine Arts, and CDH Co-Curricular Activities. Consequences may be served concurrently. Consequences will be served during the current season, or the next season of competition within one calendar year

from the date of the violation. If a student is involved in two sports and/or co-curricular activities during a season, the penalty will be applied to both sports/activities and can be served concurrently.

- If the loss of eligibility is not completed by the end of the Athletic/Co-Curricular season, the remaining portion of the loss of eligibility will be carried over into post-season Athletic/Co-Curricular competition. In the event that following post-season competition for that season, the loss of eligibility is still not completed; it will carry over into the next Athletic/Co-Curricular season of participation. (See the list of Athletic/Co-Curricular opening season dates and last dates to join if applicable).
- If a student is transferring to Cretin-Derham Hall and has a violation at their previous school, this violation must be served during his/her enrollment at Cretin-Derham Hall, prior to participating in CDH activities, based on CDH rules.
- Depending on the circumstances of violation and use, additional school related consequences may apply, including eligibility for participation on school trips.

Co-Curricular Season

Due to the complex nature in defining competition and/or performances with Co-Curricular Activities, this Policy does not define exact loss of eligibility for each Co-Curricular program however; students must serve a minimum of two weeks of ineligibility. In the event of a violation of this policy, an Advisory Committee will be established to determine the appropriate loss of eligibility in accordance with the intentions of this policy. The Advisory Committee will consist of the Activities Director, a Dean of Students, and all advisors associated with the co-curricular activity. The recommendation of this Advisory Committee is final.

Students participating in Co-Curricular and/or Athletic activities at Cretin-Derham Hall are held to high standards and will demonstrate respectful and responsible behavior at all times for continued participation. Cretin-Derham Hall provides this policy and procedures to define school interventions in times of tobacco, alcohol, other drug use and harassment violations, and MSHSL Athletic/ Fine Arts Eligibility rules. In addition to the steps listed in the Student/Parent Handbook and MSHSL Athletic/Fine Arts Eligibility rules, the following eligibility consequences will be enforced.

First Offense: Students who participate in MSHSL Athletic/Fine Arts activities will lose Athletic competition and/or Co-Curricular participation for one-third (1/3) of the season.

Students who participate in co-curricular activities not regulated by the MSHSL, will lose eligibility for a minimum of two weeks up to 1/3 of the season, as determined by the Advisory Committee.

The student must participate in all practices and/or activity preparation in order to fulfill their ineligibility consequences. Attendance at the post-season banquet is at the discretion of the coach/advisor. The student is unable to participate or attend team or activity competition, events, or publicly represent CDH as a team/activity member during the loss of eligibility. Athletic/Co-Curricular eligibility consequences begin at the completion of the suspension period, when the student is in good standing, as defined by the MSHSL Student Code of Responsibilities.

Second Offense: Consequences may include, but not limited to, probation, or a required formal assessment. The student is subject to one of the following consequences:

- If the second offense occurs within 12 months (one calendar year) of the first violation, the student will lose Athletic competition and/or Co-Curricular participation for an entire calendar year. The loss of eligibility will begin at the date of notification of the second offense. At the coaches discretion, the student may participate in all practices and/or activity preparation, during their loss of eligibility. Attendance at the post-season banquet is at the discretion of the coach/advisor. The student is unable to participate or attend as a team member during the loss of eligibility, or publicly represent CDH as a team/activity member during this loss of eligibility. However, the student may attend events as a spectator.
- If the second offense occurs more than 12 months after (one calendar year) the first violation, the student will lose Athletic competition and/or Co-Curricular participation for one-third (1/3) of the season **or** lose eligibility equivalent to the terms of the MSHSL second offense (6 contest/competitions or 3 weeks) whichever is longer.

Third Offense: May result in immediate dismissal. If the student is allowed to stay at CDH, a third offense will result in loss of participation for an entire calendar year. If the student chooses to transfer to another school, the administration will notify the school to which the student is transferring of the previous violation history, as required by the MSHSL.
