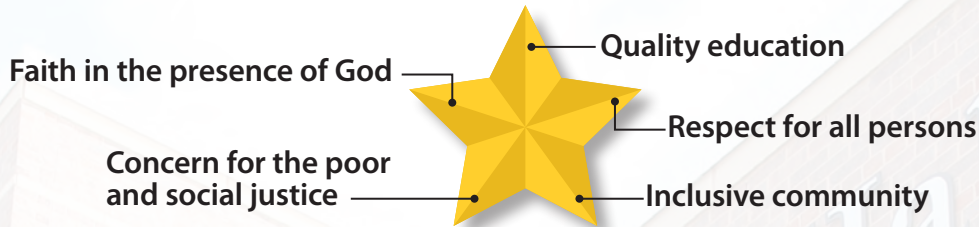

With our faith as a foundation, service and justice are integrated into our experience to create global citizens who care enough to impact our community and shape world views.

CDH provides a welcoming environment that celebrates diversity of thought, interests, race, income, and learning abilities. Our student body has 26% students of color. Raiders come from 119 different elementary/middle schools, creating an inclusive community where students make friends for life.

CDH is big enough to provide broad co-curricular opportunities so that every student can find his or her voice, place, and passion. With such a rich environment of student involvement, it is easy, and very common, to be involved in multiple activities! In fact, 95% students are in one or more sports, clubs, or activities.

Award-Winning Fine Arts

CDH approaches education as a dynamic way of life, fostering opportunities for collaboration and building personal connections that last a lifetime. The commitment to Fine Arts — theater, band, choir, and studio arts — means students have a place to explore their passions and creativity.

Preparation for Successful and Meaningful Lives

Our graduates leave CDH with amazing opportunities to fully embrace their future confidently and well prepared for whatever path they choose — earning admittance to the nation's top colleges and establishing individualized career paths for professional success.

Value

The return on a family's investment is second to none, and we are deeply committed to keeping CDH affordable. Our tuition continues to be among the lowest in the metro, due to a donor base that supports more than 1/5 of the total cost to educate each and every student, and more than \$3 million in tuition aid is awarded annually. In addition, a robust merit scholarship program rewards students who demonstrate the values of CDH.

Students earn both high school and college credit through successful completion of these rigorous courses delivered by CDH faculty who are certified by the college.

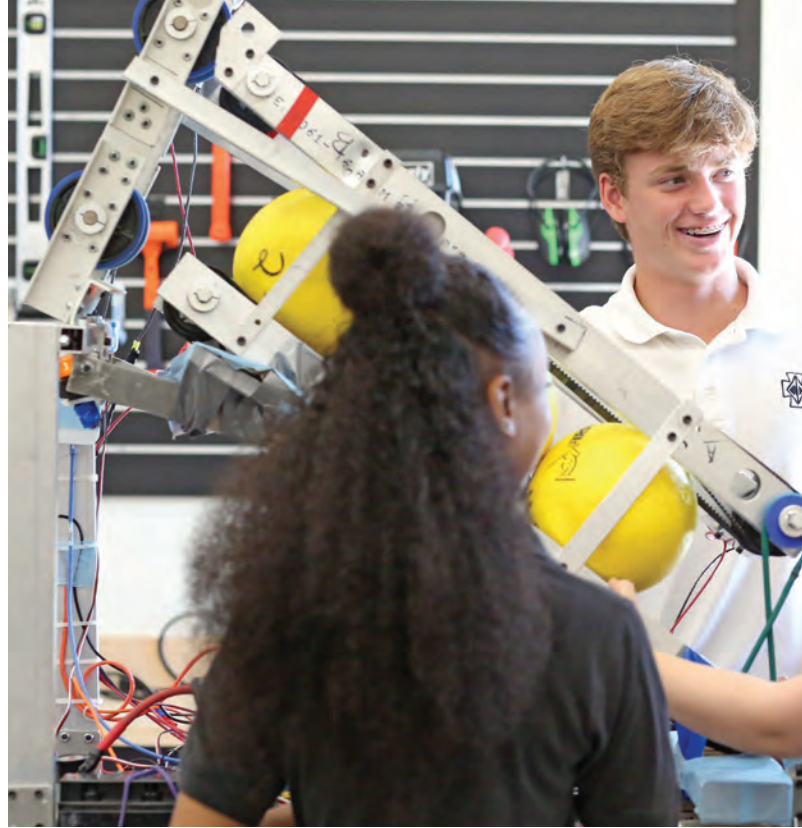

Innovative Learning

STEAM Curriculum Anchors New Science Track

All ninth graders take the foundational STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Art, Math) course to address the critical need for science skills to meet 21st century challenges in all disciplines. The new curriculum was launched a couple of years ago and is offered in all three different and distinct levels: college prep, advanced and honors.

The Ryan STEM Center opened in 2021, giving students a state-of-the-art space for both curricular and co-curricular exploration, problem-solving, design and construction. This space is in addition to the already well-equipped classrooms and labs, and includes a Design Lab and a STEM Lab.

Our students have the technological learning resources needed to enhance their critical thinking, communication skills, collaboration, and creativity while empowering them as responsible, digital citizens.

9th Grade Values Interdisciplinary Course

Values Symposium combines English, Religion, and Social Studies into a two-period class with three faculty members.



Values provides all ninth graders with a common academic experience. Content is focused on the CDH values, along with reading and writing across the disciplines.

Block Schedule

Driven by abundant research and the goal to provide longer class periods and decrease the fast pace of a traditional school day, the CDH schedule consists of a consistent three-day rotating class schedule, with classes meeting for one hour on two of every three days. There is a longer flex period at lunch allowing for academic help, study time, clubs/activity meetings, counselor visits, or prayer in addition to lunch with peers. This innovative schedule also allows time for Mass, assemblies, CASA and class meetings.

Academic Support Program

Students with specific learning needs receive the academic support needed to be successful. Reading, writing, math, and organizational support are provided as needed

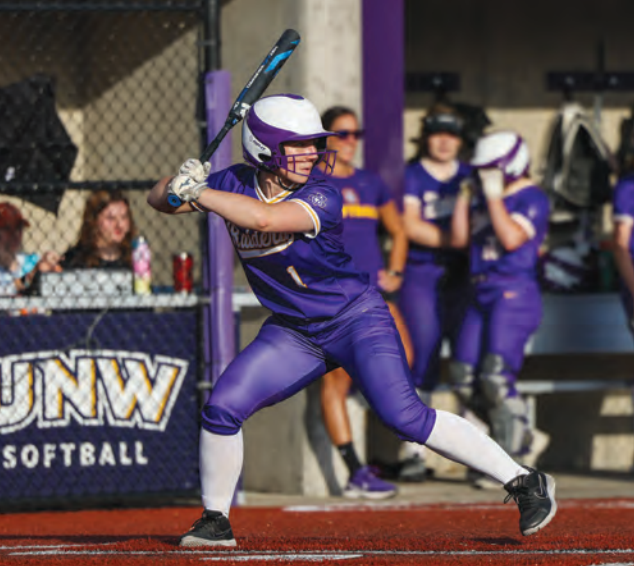

Get Involved!

CDH offers something for everyone. In fact, 95% of students are involved in one or more co-curricular activities or sports!

Join in! It is fun (and often the most memorable part of high school) — and a great way to engage in something you like to do, use your talents, or in some cases, discover new talents. Plus, you will meet new friends with different perspectives and interests. It is easy to get involved — each fall there is an Activities Fair to highlight all the clubs and organizations.

The full slate of options is worth checking out on our website — and students can start their own activity if it isn't already offered.

Co-curriculars are broadly grouped into three categories:

- **CLUBS AND ORGANIZATIONS** — *Academic competitions* such as Science Olympiad and Mock Trial. *Creative outlets* such as Art Club, Fine Arts and Yearbook. *Service opportunities* like Highland Friendship Club. *Non-varsity athletic fun* such as Intramural Basketball, Ultimate Frisbee, and Bowling. *Leadership opportunities* such as Link Crew and Student Council
- **CAMPUS MINISTRY** — Service outreach and worship leadership
- **ATHLETICS** — 27 different teams at all levels. 91% of students participate in at least one sport

The brand new Ryan STEM Center is designed to give students, from across all curricular areas, a significant opportunity to be creative, take risks, explore solutions, learn by doing, and collaborate with fellow students and teachers. This innovative space is a hub of learning and preparation for 21st century challenges.

CASA (Connecting Adults and Students to Achieve)

A unique framework of family and house communities focused on building and maintaining connections at CDH. Everyone is involved, including all students and faculty, plus the administration, custodians, and advancement staff. The common goal is to support each other socially, academically, spiritually, and more.

LEADERSHIP ACADEMY

The CDH principles and standards are the foundation for a unique curriculum for all 11th graders, designed to develop and utilize the skills necessary for our students to positively lead within our school and the broader community. As seniors, students can complete a capstone project focused on impacting our community, which will also be listed on the transcript.

COMMITMENT TO DIVERSITY, EQUITY AND INCLUSION

In alignment with our mission and values, CDH has made a long-term commitment to ensuring each CDH student feels valued and respected in our community, while seeking better understanding of the need for racial justice in our world. Value

Cretin-Derham Hall provides a high quality education, second to none, that is rigorous and challenging at every level — while being realistically attainable.

We understand that tuition is an investment — with a return on that investment realized not only for the 4 years of high school, but in the impact these four critical years have on our students' lives beyond CDH.

We strive to provide a high return on that investment.

Our alumni network provides significant funding so that tuition is among the lowest in the state for Catholic high schools. In addition, we offer a generous tuition assistance program based on a family's need, and merit scholarships to recognize the gifts and talents of our incoming students.

Merit Scholarships for Incoming 9th Grade Students

Committed to excellence, CDH offers several distinctive, merit-based scholarships to recognize the gifts and talents that our incoming students bring to our CDH community. The value is significant and ranges from \$1,000–\$10,000 per year.

- **Academic Excellence** — for those who receive a national cumulative score of 90% or higher on the placement test. Students must test at CDH.
- **Carondelet and LaSallian Scholars** — for those young women or young men who exemplify the values that best represent the CDH community: Faith, Leadership, and Service. Students must apply.
- **Schaller JROTC Scholarships** — for those students who plan to participate in JROTC. Students must apply.

Tuition Assistance

Thanks to the generosity of alumni, faculty, staff, and our community, we are committed to making a CDH education affordable for your family. CDH distributed \$3.1 million in assistance to 56% of our families in 2022-2023.
