What to Expect

NACAC Virtual College Fairs are designed from the ground up as mobile experiences that are intuitive, informative, interactive, and fun.

 During each NACAC Virtual College Fair, hundreds of college and university representatives will be available to talk with you and other students!

- On the day of each fair, log into *virtualcollegefairs.org* using your phone or computer. It's totally easy to get around.
- Create your itinerary by selecting which colleges you're interested in. Then attend
 the colleges' live and interactive Zoom sessions. The sessions cover topics such
 as how to apply, financial aid, and student life. They are presented by admission
 staff and sometimes feature current students, faculty, or alumni. Watch, learn,
 and get your questions answered about academics, athletics, diversity, study
 abroad, and much more.
- You can also meet virtually one-on-one with a college's admission representative.
 Just choose a meeting date and time.
- And, no worries if you don't know where to start! We can help. Each fair offers NACAC Meet-Ups with information on how to find your best college fit, paying for college (in English and Spanish), and more. Plus, you can ask for advice from a college counseling expert via chat.

We are excited to announce that MACAC will be partnering with StriveScan to produce our Virtual College Exploration program for Minnesota students this fall.

The goal of the Virtual College Exploration program is to provide students with a wealth of college search information, allow them to browse and learn about different colleges, and ask questions of admissions counselors, all in a safe, flexible, online format.

The program will consist of college knowledge sessions on topics such as finding a college that fits, choosing a major, tips for writing a college essay, and more, presented by admission counselors.
