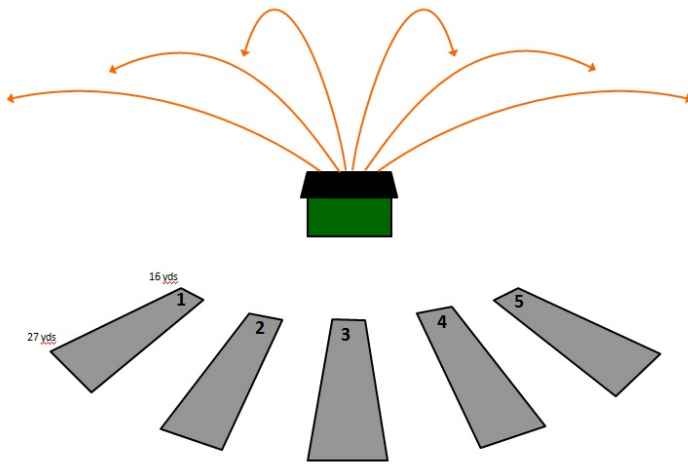


TRAP or SKEET

Trap - Shooters fire from five stations in straight-away fashion. A shooter prepares by bringing the gun to the shoulder and shouting “pull.” A target is released from a hidden center location. The clay “bird” flies at 76 feet a second and the trap shooter squeezes the trigger from a 16-yard station

Long range • Targets rotate • Targets always fly away • Single Shot



Skeet- A skeet shooting field has two “houses,” one high, one low, that sit to the right and left of the shooters’ eight stations from which the call is made for the clay “birds” to be released. The targets emerge from the houses at a high rate of speed, never more than 35 yards away. As the bright red clay discs cross in an arc before the shooter aims the shotgun and fires, hoping to break the targets.

Short range • Targets fly every direction • Doubles
