Governor Announces Shelter in Place - CDH Online School continues until 5/4/20

Wednesday, March 25, 2020 (3 pm) - Today, Governor Tim Walz has announced that Minnesota is entering into a critical phase in battling the spread of COVID-19 with a Shelter in Place Order for the State of Minnesota from March 27 at 11:59 pm through April 10. This will be followed by continued physical distancing measures. At this time, we can tell you:

- 1. Online School will continue for CDH until Monday, May 4 to comply with the state's distance learning plan announced today. We will continue to implement Online School for this duration and will keep you updated.
- 2. <u>MSHSL</u> will honor the Governor's executive order and will suspend all spring sports until the state lifts these distance learning measures. No decisions about the cancellation of the spring season have been made.
- 3. CDH will be on Easter Break Monday, April 6 Monday, April 13. Thus, Online School is also on Easter Break for all students and faculty. Online School will resume on Tuesday, April 14.

Please take this time for rest and relaxation, even as the Shelter In Place continues in Minnesota. As Governor Walz decreed, it is critical that we all refrain from gathering outside our homes or other types of travel during this time, to protect your health, that of your family, and of our local community. As this is also our Holy Week, we pray for your own journey through Holy Week toward Easter.

As COVID-19 evolves on a daily basis, it cannot be overlooked that *together*, Cretin-Derham Hall, we made it through our first five days of Online School. It was not necessarily easy or without unforeseen challenges, but we did it! We are incredibly inspired and proud of everyone in our community for stepping up to this challenge that COVID-19 has handed us. We know these days are not at all what any one of us anticipated even two weeks ago. Together, we have responded in ways that protect our community's health and wellness while staying Raider Strong. We will tackle the next few weeks with the same spirit and commitment!

We are tremendously grateful for the hard work and dedication of our faculty and staff who have launched this new format for our CDH learning so that we can continue to provide an on-going CDH education even while we are not all together on our campus. This is no small task - our teachers are committed to helping their students adapt to an online learning environment by redesigning lessons, re-writing curriculum and implementing new teaching methodology.

We also want to honor the changing roles and responsibilities of our families who are managing students at home, many with varying ages and levels of remote learning, in addition to running a household and managing their own work responsibilities.
