

Reims

Before becoming intimately related to Saint Jean-Baptiste De La Salle and the Institute of the Brothers of the Christian Schools, Reims had been the cradle of French Christianity. Reims is one of the oldest and most historical towns in France. In early Roman times, the town was the capital of the Celtic tribe of the Remi. The city (pop. 200,000; 30,000 in de La Salle's day) lies 90 miles northeast of Paris on the banks of the small River Vesle in the wine growing region of Champagne. Jean-Baptiste was born in Reims on April 30, 1651. He was the oldest child of Louis de La Salle and Nicole Moët de Brouillet. Their family lived in Reims for generations and was where de La Salle's vocation found its beginnings.

Liesse

The day after Trinity Sunday, 1686, when de La Salle and the Brothers took their first vows, they made the pilgrimage to Liesse, walking all through the night, and again pronounced the vows at the foot of the statue of Our Lady of Joy (a small black statue above the main altar). De La Salle also visited Liesse on his way to visit the communities of Laon and Guise. The church is now a minor basilica. The second chapel of the left-hand side is dedicated to de LaSalle. A beautiful window depicts de La Salle kneeling with five Brothers before Notre Dame de Liesse. The inscription on the window reads: "1684: St. John Baptist de La Salle consecrated his Brothers to N.D. de Liesse."

Le Puy

The Sisters of the Child Jesus was founded in 1676 in Le Puy-en-Velay, France by Ann-Marie Martel to care for the sick and educate poor girls. Anne-Marie was born in 1644, the daughter of a Magistrate, a position of affluence and prestige. She could have lived a life of comfort and privilege. When she was only 21 years old, Anne-Marie's confessor, recognizing her exceptional devotion to God, invited her to minister to the women in a small hospital for the destitute. She brought her desire to serve the Father to women who knew only physical and spiritual deprivation. Within a year, Anne-Marie was asked to teach catechism to street children. She was quickly joined in her work by others who responded to her desire to serve God through love of the poor. At the age of 27, Anne-Marie died without knowing that she had, in fact, founded a community of religious women. In her short life, Anne-Marie Martel had an impact that is still echoing throughout the world.

Paris

De La Salle began his time in Paris schooling at St. Sulpice and the Sorbonne. In 1688, February 24, he arrived in Paris with two Brothers from Reims. The parish priest of Saint Sulpice put them up in the Sulpician School of the Rue Princesse. Eventually, they took over the nearby cramped school for the poor of the parish. It was from Paris that they demonstrated that their ministry reached beyond the confines of the diocese of Reims.

Rouen

Rouen has long been associated with Joan of Arc, but its other famous saint is de La Salle. De La Salle and the Brothers endured many hardships in order to become established throughout Rouen, and their property at St. Yon became a model educational enterprise, both for students and Brothers alike. The industrial city of Rouen in northern France included many poor families in the 17th century, whose children were often left to roam by themselves while their parents worked. De La Salle himself lived at St. Yon for many years, and it was here that he spent his last days, dying in the Brothers' community on April 7, 1719.
