
12th Grade Summer Reading Assignment for WRIT 1201 (English 12/Writing Studio)



Outcasts United, by Warren St. John, builds on a story that started as a 2007 New York Times article about the Fugees, a soccer program for boys from families of refugees from war-torn nations who were resettled in Clarkston, Georgia. The book centers on Luma Mufleh, the Fugee's coach, who came to the U.S. from Jordan to attend Smith College and staved in the U.S. despite her family's expectations. The book follows the challenges she and her players and their families face from confronting prejudice to living with memories of tragedy in their home countries. The book also details their triumphs on and off the field. *
